


# Writing

The Global Scale of English is transforming English teaching and learning, offering a granular, real-world measure of English language proficiency across the four skills. Some examples of what a learner can do in Writing on the GSE scale:

Can write the letters of the alphabet in upper and lower case

31



Can use very basic connectors like and, but, so and then

46



Can write a description of a future event or activity

59



Can write a formal email/letter of thanks or apology with appropriate conventions

74



Can write a detailed description of a complex process

26



Can use basic punctuation (e.g. commas, full stops, question marks)

36



Can make simple comparisons between people, places or things

52



Can summarise the main message from simple diagrams (e.g. graphs, bar charts)

65



Can write a letter of complaint with appropriate register, structure and conventions

77



Can write a detailed critical review of cultural events (e.g. plays, films, concerts) or literary works
